

The Post Kathmandu Status and Strategy Note

**by: The Government of Indonesia
Presented on The 1st Asia Ministerial Conference
Hua Hin-Thailand, 27-30 January 2010**

1. NATIONAL GOALS FOR REVERSING THE TRAJECTORY OF EXTINCTION, are confirmed:

- **In the National Workshop on Tiger Conservation in Jakarta (Jan 20th, 2010)**
- **By sending DG PHKA letter No S.35/IV-KKH /2010, Jan 18th, 2010 to remind all head districts to implement the Declaration of 10 Governors within Sumatra Island and 4 Ministers regarding on the Saving of Sumatra Island Ecosystem**
- **Minister of Forestry has appointed Miss of Indonesia 2009 as a Tiger Ambassador in Jan. 20th, 2010**
- **Minister of Forestry has released 2 Sumatran Tiger to the wild in Bukit Barisan Selatan National Park (Jan. 22, 2010). Up to now are 13 Sumatran Tiger have been released to the wild in Sumatera island.**

2. COUNTRY RELEVANCE OF KATHMANDU RECOMMENDATIONS

- **From 15 Kathmandu recommendations, only one recommendation is not applicable for Indonesia, that is: trans-boundary tiger landscapes cooperation.**
- **14 recommendations are relevant to Indonesia, in different level of relevancy.**

3. POST-KATHMANDU DISCUSSIONS WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT, INFRASTRUCTURE, TOURISM OR FINANCE

a. In co-operation with:

- ▶ CITES Secretariat, ASEAN-WEN, POLRI, PPATK, Custom, Quarantine, and NGOs on patrol, public awareness/campaign (conservation and related laws & regulations), capacity building (training on : identification of species, investigation on environmental crime)**

- b. Applying Indonesia National Single Window (INSW) on export, import and re-export of protected flora and fauna to reduce illegal wildlife trade (will launched by the President of Indonesia in January 2010)**
- c. Coordination with Provincial Planning Agency and Provincial Infrastructur Agency (Bina Marga & Cipta Karya) of Nanggroe Aceh Darussalam at early Jan 2010 to incorporate wildlife habitats, homeranges and corridors in road development project.**

4. STATUS OF “GAME CHANGING” ACTIONS IDENTIFIED IN KATHMANDU

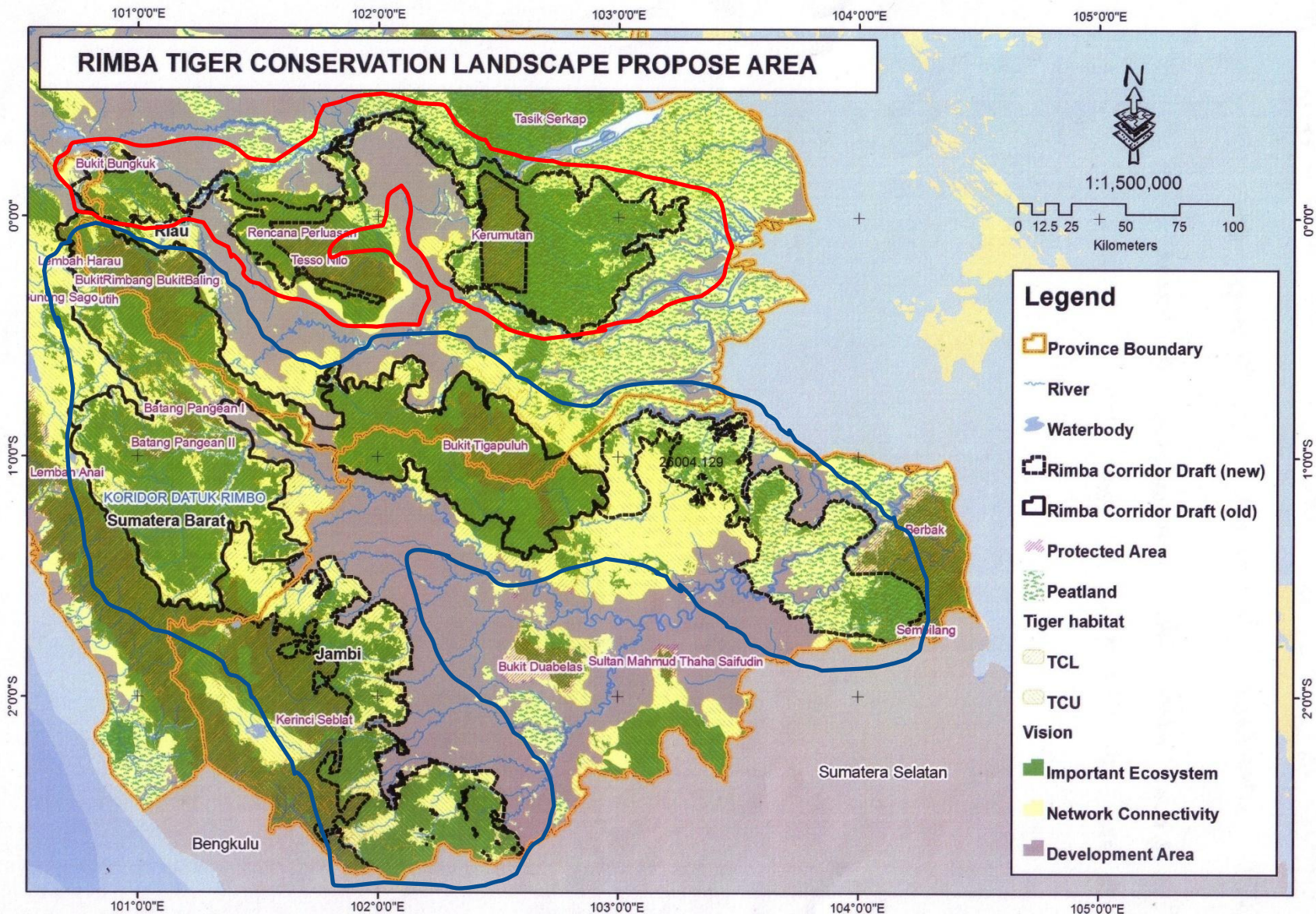
a. PROGRESS:

1) Secure agreements *in principle* from (a) Sumatra’s provincial Governors concerning TCLs

- ▶ Reminding all head districts to implement the Declaration on the Saving of Sumatra Island Ecosystem
- ▶ FGD on Tiger Conservation in Muaro Jambi (Oct 14th, 2009) and Solok Selatan (Nov 4th, 2009)
- ▶ Regional Workshop on Tiger Conservation in Jambi (Dec 8th-9th, 2009)
- ▶ National Workshop on Tiger Conservation (Jan. 20, 2020)

- ▶ **Indonesia Government Regulation No. 26 of 2008 concerning National Spatial Planning, which declares Ecosystem Leuser as National Strategic Conservation Area, follows with:**
 - **Development of Sumatra Island Spatial Planning - still on discussion Process – adopt the development in ecosystem base**
 - **Establishment of Road Map to save Sumatran Ecosystem 2020**
 - **Consulting the Road Map to save Sumatran Ecosystem 2020 in Provinces of West Sumatra, Jambi and Riau**
 - **Declaration of Ulu Masen in Aceh Province by the Governor as Provincial Strategic Area**

- ▶ **The Permit for Estate Plantation based on Indonesia Law No. 18 of 2004, and Indonesia MoA no. 26 of 2007 which mentions the requirement of EIA & Technical recommendation from District Forestry Agency.**



- **Example: Area in blue line is being consulted with 3 Provincial Planning Agency to be TCL, while in the red line is still being discussed and not being consulted yet (Prov of Riau, West Sumatra, South Sumatra)**

2) Dialogue with Nat'l Planning Agency & Ministry of Finance on current budget allocation for priority species conservation, and on innovative funding sources for TCL management

- ▶ Had been discussed in the National Workshop on Tiger Conservation in Jakarta (Jan 20th, 2010)**
- ▶ Indonesian Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (IBSAP) 2003-2020 developed by Nat'l Planning Agency as a reference in developing the national strategy and budget allocation.**

3) Promote broad adoption of habitat offsets and REDD as impact mitigation measures

- ▶ **To urge the implementation of Sumatra Island Spatial Planning, particularly by forestry stakeholders.**
- ▶ **To facilitate the proposal of ecosystem restoration in production and conservation forests related to tiger habitat in Sumatra.**
- ▶ **Demonstration plot for REDD is in Jambi Province in cooperation with Australia, designated in 2009, and will be started in 2010.**
- ▶ **Coordination with Provincial Planning Agency and Provincial Infrastructur Agency (Ministry of Public Work) of Nanggroe Aceh Darussalam not to fragmented wildlife habitat on developing infrastructure.**
- ▶ **In many occasions, it is being delivered to ask stakeholders' commitment in conserving wildlife (not only tiger) as part of the ecosystem, and not fragmented its habitat .**

4) Ensure available intelligence is used to reduce killing and trafficking of tigers and loss of tiger habitat

- ▶ **Host intelligence training for government officials for TRCs in Jakarta at Dec 2009**
- ▶ **Indonesian Police Headquarter in cooperation with International Criminal Investigative Training Assistance Program (ICITAP) – Ministry of Justice of USA, executing training of investigation on environmental crime in Dec 2009 (Balikpapan, East Kalimantan) – regarding CITES Mechanism and Species Protection Regulations**
- ▶ **Camera/ Video Traps for better patrolling efficiency**
- ▶ **MIST has being implemented and modified by several NGOs in several regions in Sumatra**

5) Establish district-level tiger-human conflict response units in problem areas paid for using State district budget, and use them to inform people how to reduce the risks before they become a problem

- ▶ **To urge all head districts within Sumatra Island to implement the Tiger National Action Plan and establish human-wildlife conflict response unit (coordination team and task force) through DG PHKA letter No S.35/IV-KKH /2010, January 18th, 2010**
- ▶ **Socialization of Mitigation of Human – Wildlife Conflict guideline in Bengkulu on Nov 2009, one commitment being asked was the establishment of human-wildlife conflict response unit (coordination team and task force) involving local government, private sectors, local NGOs and the community.**

b. Plan in implementing the Game Changing

- ▶ **Direct all technical implementation units (BB/BKSDA and BB/BTN) within PHKA to actively participate in reviewing Provincial and District Spatial Planning to secure TCLs.**
- ▶ **Enhance the communication with Provincial and District Planning Agencies to incorporate wildlife habitat in EIA document and protection of TCL for forest utilization (forest plantation, estate plantation, mining, settlement and infrastructure project).**
- ▶ **Implement comprehensive strategy in conflict human – tiger mitigation, including develop and socialized practice guideline as well as the establishment of coordination team and task force at provincial/ district level.**



c. Key constraints and cost associated to implementing the actions.

- ▶ **Budget allocations, human resources, political will, institutional rigidity**

5. EXTENT OF GOVERNMENT SUPPORT OF A TIGER STABILIZATION AND RECOVERY AGENDA

In co-operation with World Bank:

- ▶ FGD on Tiger Conservation in Muaro Jambi (Oct 14th, 2009) and Solok Selatan (Nov 4th, 2009)**
- ▶ Regional Workshop on Tiger Conservation in Jambi (Dec 8th-9th, 2009)**
- ▶ National Workshop on Tiger Conservation in Jakarta (Jan 20th, 2010)**

6. INTERNATIONAL SUPPORT NEEDED

- ▶ Preparing proposal DNS I USA -Tropical Forest Conservation Act/TFCA for key biodiversity area and flagship species corridors in 13 areas in Sumatra – will start in 2011**
- ▶ DNS VI (KfW-Germany) – conservation of 3 umbrella species (rhino, elephant, tiger) in 5 provinces in Sumatra**
- ▶ International organization should refer the national action plan and priorities**

7. MONITORING SYSTEMS AND KEY PROGRESS INDICATORS

- **Draft of monitoring system and progress indicators will be developed with the involving of related stakeholders**
