# Priority Activities 2011

<b>Habitat Management</b>	
Removed a total of 2.277 illegal households in BBSNP covering a total of 15.527 ha of encroachment, and 6.000 hectares of degraded lands, especially the ex-encroachment areas, are planned to be restored	Ongoing
Ongoing effort to remove illegal households inside GLNP, and 20.000 hectares of degraded lands, especially the ex-encroachment areas, are planned to be restored	Ongoing
Encourage the private to develop a restoration ecosystem concession in Bukit Tiga Puluh NP landscape	Ongoing
Eradicating the invasive species ( <i>Meremia peltata</i> ) and restore the areas covering 2.300 ha in BBSNP	Ongoing

# Getting Better?

- ▣ An increased commitment of MoF to improve the management system and habitat improvement of conservation areas
- ▣ An institutional commitment of MoF to increase the population of 14 priority species, including Sumatran Tiger
- ▣ A support from the Ministry of Environmental to the MoF GEF/PIF proposal
- ▣ MoF has targeted the DNS 5 to Sumatran Tiger, and TFCA for the habitat management

# Threats to Habitats / TCLs

- ▣ Plan of roads construction in Kerinci Seblat Landscape
  - Endangered status has been inscribed by UNESCO's World Heritage committee
  - A public campaign has been launched
  - ATBC resolution opposing roads construction in KSNP
  - Minister of Forestry have set up an independent team to assess the feasibility of the road construction
- ▣ Encroachment and is still a major problem of TCLs
  - However, an increased effort has recently been devoted by MoF to move out illegal settlements and restore the encroached areas in BBSNP and GLNP

2. An island wide database on Tiger – Human Conflict
3. An island-wide database on Wildlife Crime
4. RAPAM and METT assessment on the all NPs in tiger habitat, data 2010
5. Targeting Peer-reviewed publication

# National Monitoring System

- ▣ An increased capacity on habitat management by the MoF, i.e. the resort-based management, encroachment mitigation taskforce, RAPAM and METT assessment for the NPs in tiger habitat.
- ▣ Human, financial, and technical capacities on biological monitoring, THC mitigation, and routine law enforcement patrol remain initiated and led by International NGOs
