



# Global Tiger Recovery Program

## Mapping of Financial Resources

May 2011

The Global Tiger Recovery Program (GTRP), developed jointly by the 13 Tiger Range Countries<sup>1</sup> (TRCs), was endorsed by all of the TRCs at the International Tiger Forum, St. Petersburg, Russian Federation, on November 23, 2010. The GTRP is supported by 80 national investment activities in all TRCs, and also several transboundary and regional activities over the first five years of implementation. Conducting these activities will require about US\$350 million additional (incremental) funding over current level of investments. International tiger conservation partners made financial pledges at the Forum in St. Petersburg of up to US\$370 million according to an analysis by WWF.

The purpose of this mapping exercise of financial resources for implementation of the GTRP is to identify and confirm:

1. current and potential donors willing to provide financial resources;
2. amount of incremental external resources available from these donors; and
3. country and thematic financial gaps that emerge after separating incremental from ongoing investments.

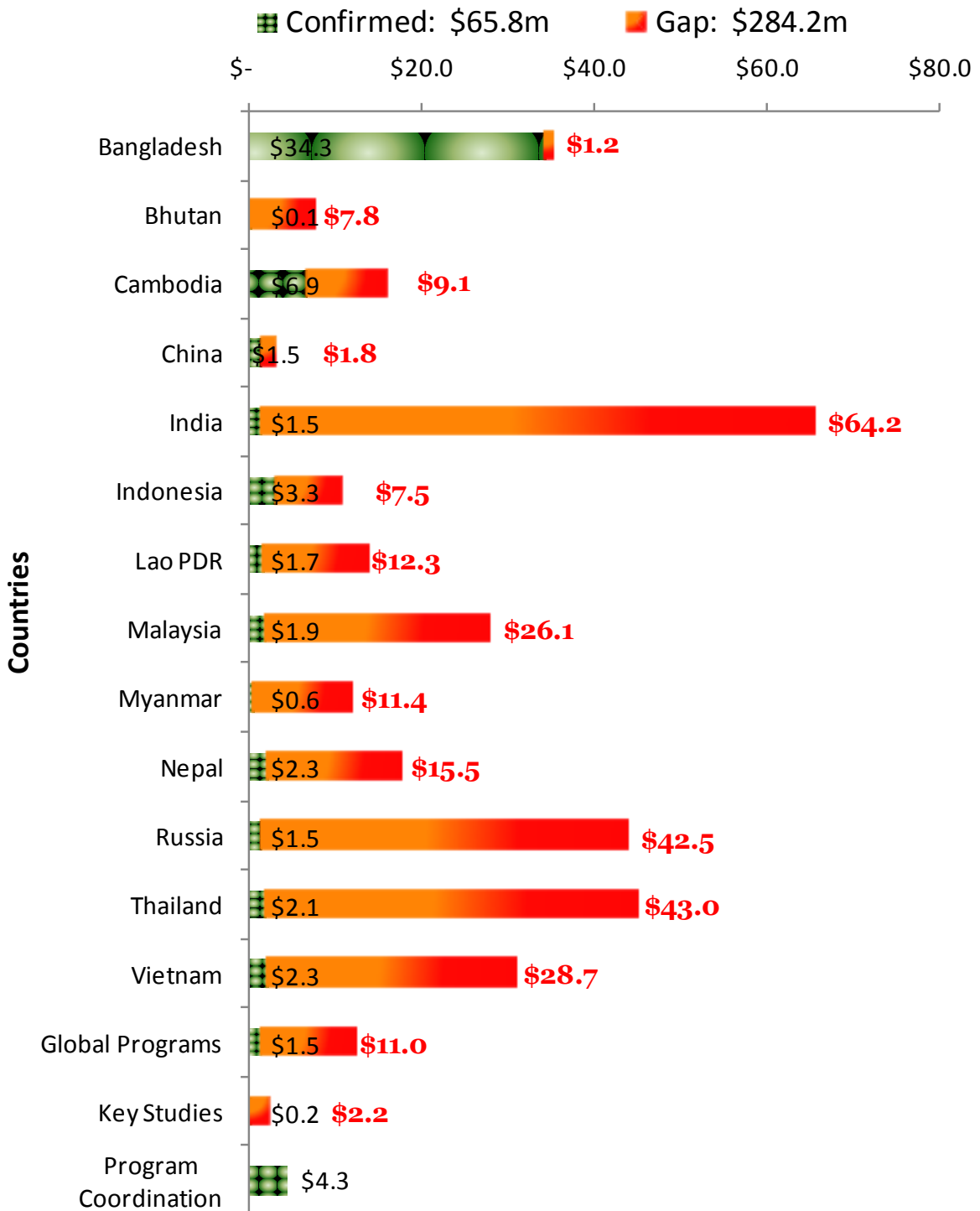
"Confirmed" means that the donor has informed the GTI Secretariat that funds are available for use in 2011. "Incremental" means new funding has been pledged after the St. Petersburg Forum and directed into the GTRP/NTRP Portfolio. "External" means that resources originate from outside the TRCs.

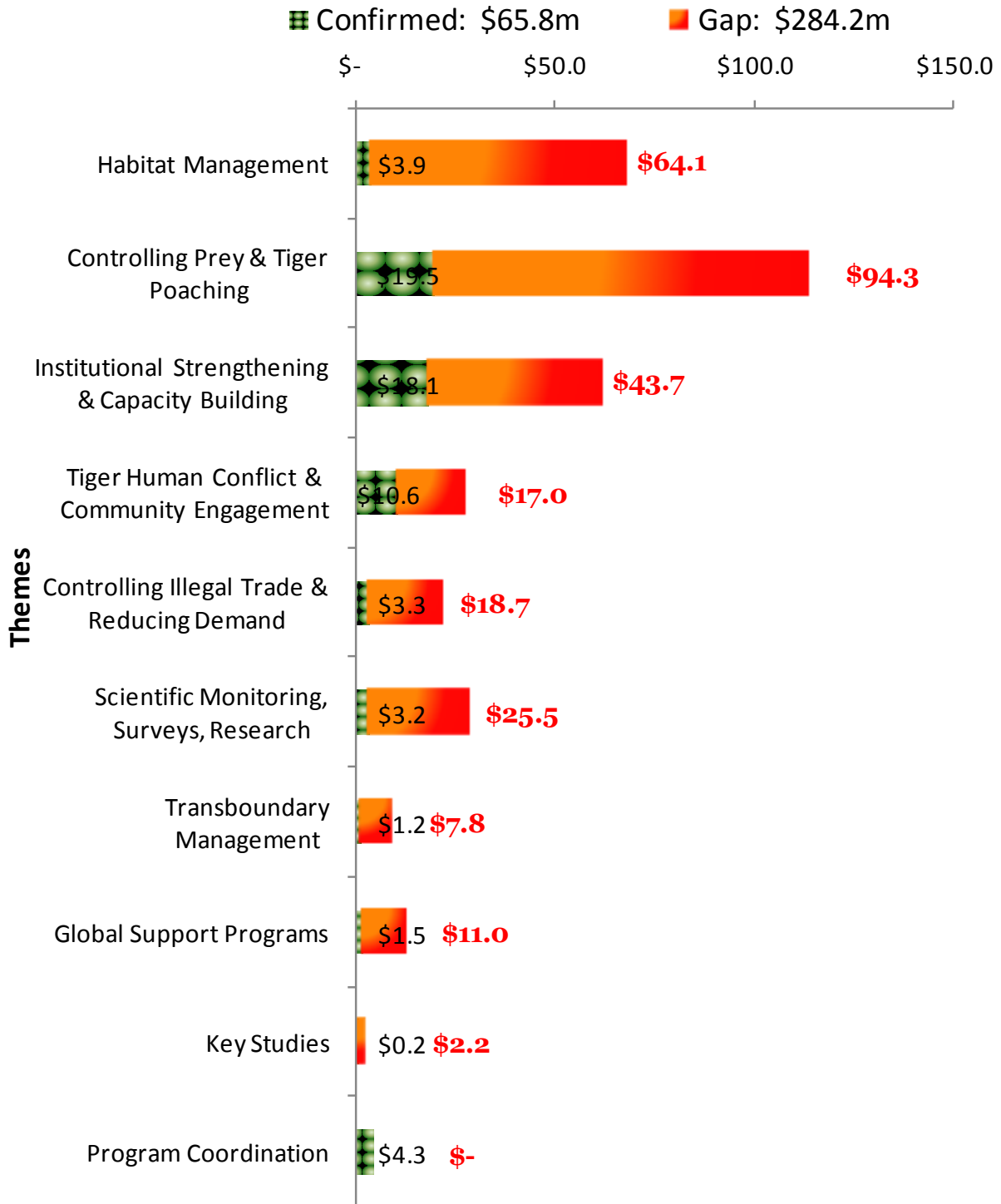

### Chart 1. Gaps by Countries

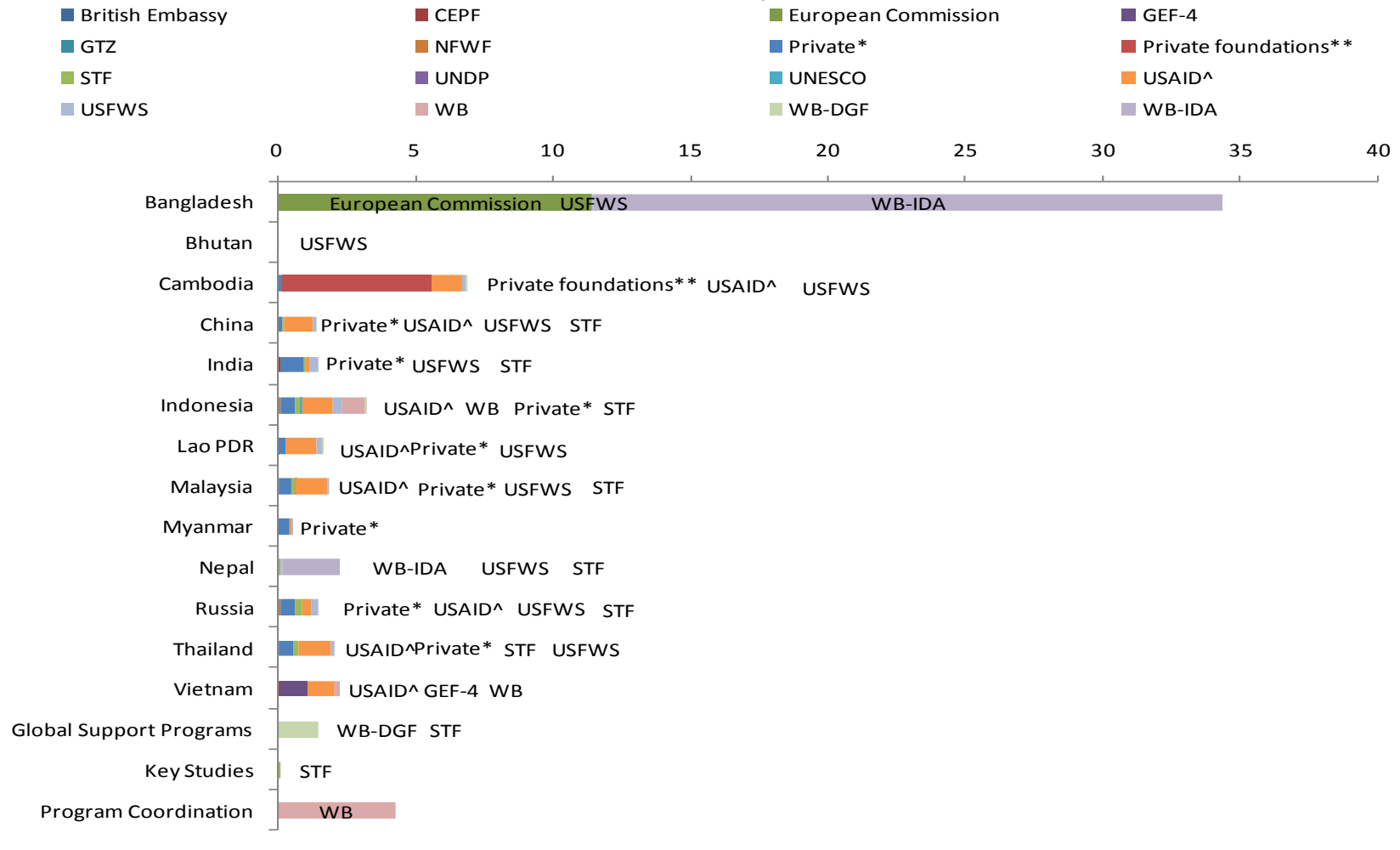


**GTRP Resource Mobilization, US\$ million, May 2011**

**Chart 3. Confirmed Resources by Countries and Donors**

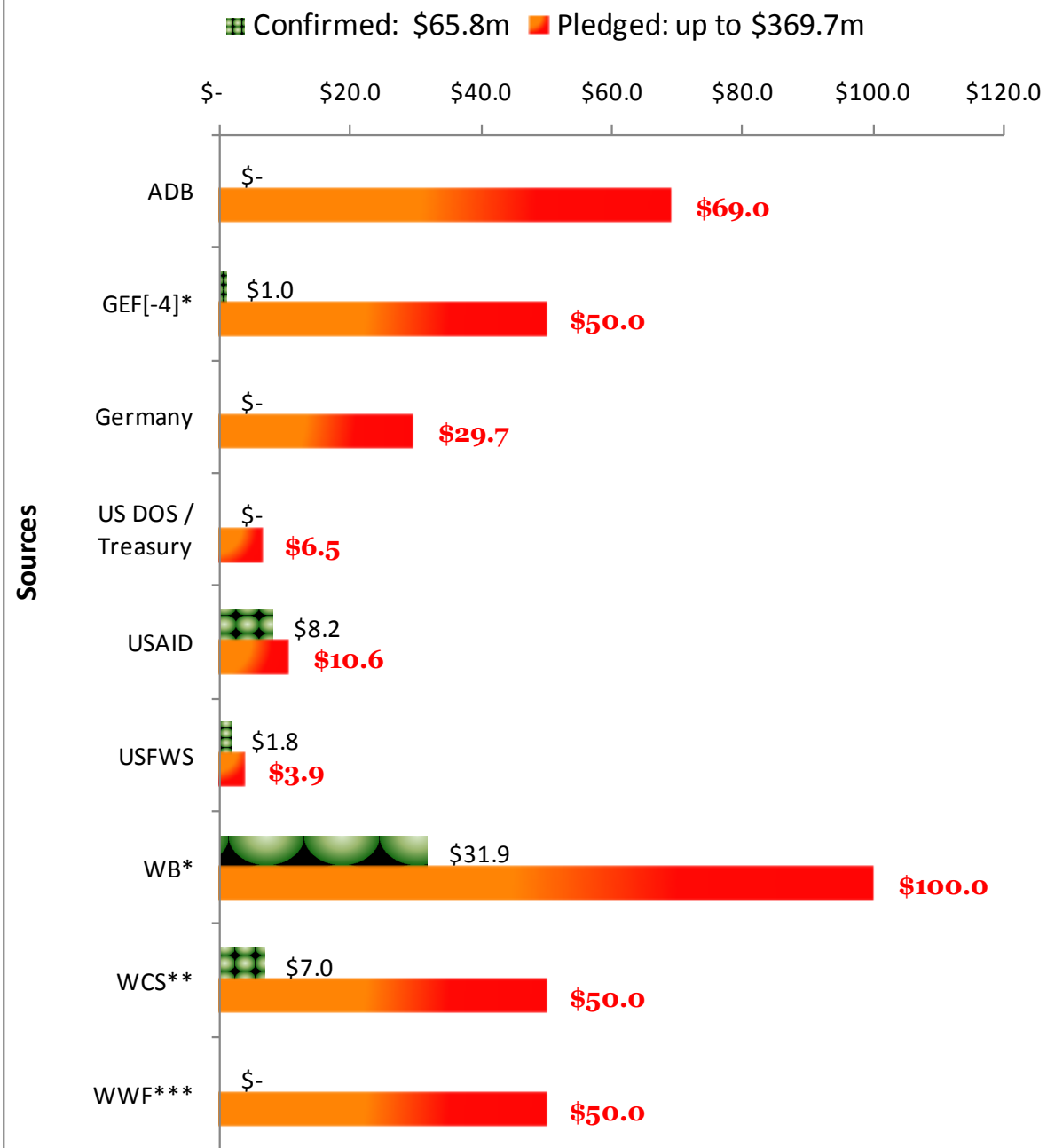
